Boys & Girls Clubs of King County Teams Up With USDA Food Program to Provide More Meals for More Kids

Today Boys & Girls Clubs of King County announced its sponsorship of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program administrated by the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). Meals will be made available to members of the Southwest Boys & Girls Club at no separate charge and without regard to race, color, national origin, gender, age, or disability. Parental income determines the amount of money OSPI will reimburse institutions to provide meals to enrolled children. The monthly income-eligibility guidelines listed below are used to determine the reimbursement from OSPI.
